On The Miracle Of Creation

The earth brought forth vegetation, plants yielding seed according to their own kinds, and trees bearing fruit in which is their seed, each according to its kind. And God saw that it was good."

From the earliest memories of my childhood, Spring has been a favorite time of the year for me. Perhaps in those youngest days it sprouted from a desire to be done with winter, but from the first warm days and melting snow to the full bloom of greenery, Spring has given me an exhilaration that I do not feel during other times of the year.

I don't suppose I am alone in that. I would imagine that everyone except for the diehard skiers and ice fishermen is glad to see the snow melt, and who doesn't love the freshness that blooming flowers and flourishing greenery brings to the air. During Spring, life explodes all around us, and it is very refreshing.

Yet it occurred to me this year that perhaps one reason Spring is so pleasant is that it is a miniature demonstration of God's creative power. What I mean is that it can be hard to relate to God as the creator of everything, and hard to imagine all of creation coming together in six days in response to God's spoken Word. Yet it is somehow easier to imagine during Springtime, when the earth sprouts vegetation, the flowers burst forth in unexpected places, the birds and insects and animals, as if on cue, all begin to work diligently at their tasks.

And the thing that strikes me the most is that no one has to tell them what to do. Spring is not like a project or a celebration that we prepare for in advance. It just happens. Whether early or late, when God says it is time, life swings into action. One day you wake up to the sound of birds. You notice some flowers peeking out. And then everything is green, and growing so fast that it changes every day.

It's a good lesson for us, really, that the God who created the first Eden is the same God who brings forth life every Spring. It is a good lesson because sometimes we can forget that he is able to refresh and make new, and bring green life where there was only brown dormancy. God is the God of life! And during this season of Easter, may you find refreshment in knowing that your life is joined to His, as a thriving vine is joined to the branch. I hope your Spring is joyful and vibrant as your eyes are opened to see the power of His life in you.



What to do Immediately When Your Power Goes Out

Starting in April we will be experiencing severe thunderstorms or tornado. When your power goes out unexpectedly, it can turn your day or the next few days into chaos. Power can go out instantly for several reasons, and you should be prepared. Here are a few suggestions when the lights do go out, and how to respond immediately.

First, Call Your Consumer Power Company to Report the Outage. This can also give you some peace of mind knowing when the power may be restored.



Check Your Appliances, Unplug or Turn Them Off. Right after the power goes out, go around the house and turn off or unplug your devices and appliances. Not only will this protect them from any surges when the power comes back on, but it is also a crucial safety step. Imagine you had something cooking or left an iron on before the power went out. Once the power is restored, these could become a fire hazard if you're not around to see them when the power comes on.

Keep Your Refrigerator and Freezer Closed. This will maintain the safety of your food. If the power is out for less than four hours, your refrigerated food should be safe. For longer outages, pack your perishables or medications into a cooler with ice to keep them at a safe temperature below 40°F. A fully stocked freezer will keep safe for about 48 hours, but this drops to just 24 hours if it's only half full.



Have Battery Flashlights and Battery Lanterns Ready. Candles might work for a short period of time, but they can pose a fire risk. Always have batteries on hand for extended periods as well. Also, have you recently installed new batteries in your alarm systems? This is important when the power is off for an extended period.

Water Usage. You and your family will need fluids. The rule of thumb is 'half your body weight in pounds, to ounces of fluid'. For example, if a person weighs 200 pounds, half of it is 100, which is the same number of ounces in fluids that person would need each day. If you don't have stored water, maybe you can borrow some from a neighbor.



Keep an Eye on Your Family Members. Extreme temperatures, whether hot or cold, can pose a significant risk. Designate a safe space in your home where everyone can stay comfortable, e.g., a basement during summer heat or a well-insulated central room in cold weather. Dress accordingly, stay hydrated, and go to an alternate place for safety if needed. Pay special attention to the needs of infants and elderly, or anyone with health issues.

Cooking Safely Without Power. If you find yourself needing to cook during an outage, your best bet is to head outdoors. A grill or camp stove can be a great solution. Just make sure to set it up in a safe, open area to avoid fire hazards. If you have a fireplace that is well-maintained, it can also be used for warmth and basic cooking. Canned food is particularly handy since it can be heated in the open can after the label is removed. If you are not able to use these options, go to your pantry. There may be several options, such as



canned or dried food, e.g., water added to a can of tomato soup, crackers, peanut butter and jelly sandwiches, beef jerky, nuts, fresh, canned, or dried fruit, baked beans, spaghetti-O's, protein bars, juice, etc.


Carbon Monoxide Is Real and You Can't Smell It. Always keep generators at least 20 feet away from your home to avoid carbon monoxide accumulation. Never use your oven or gas range for heating because it is a dangerous source of carbon monoxide.

Now is the time to prepare for when outages do happen. Stock up on batteries and get non-perishable food or water supplies.
